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Tips From The Public Works Department

Storm Water Management

Please be aware that dumping trash, ashes, paint, cleaning solutions, oil, etc., into storm water facilities is prohibited. Storm water facilities are defined as inlets, pipes, drainage swales, etc. The storm drain system is designed to help prevent flooding by carrying excess rainwater away from streets.

Whatever goes into the drainage facility by your home eventually ends up in a waterway. A few ways that you can help the effort to restore and maintain a healthy watershed is by disposing of water properly, cleaning up after your pets, using fertilizers properly to prevent excess runoff, and storing materials that could pollute storm water indoors. Also, please monitor storm water inlets near your property; no one should dump anything into the storm sewer system.

Additionally, please note that street sweeping takes place in order to better maintain the health of our watershed. It is not meant to pick up leaves, twigs, etc.

Please help keep our streams clean!

Storm Drain Cleaning & Maintenance

Because Manheim Borough is in a low-lying area, the probability of water damage and flooding is much higher than in many other communities. Because of our geographic location, the Public Works Department places a high priority on keeping our streams free of excessive blockage and storm drain cleaning and maintenance. There are several things that all of us can do as "preventive maintenance" to help avoid possible property damage issues due to excessive water:

1. Do not mow lawn grass clippings into the street. During a heavy downpour these small grass clippings float to the nearest storm drain and accumulate on top of the storm drain grate, preventing the water from entering the storm drain system and causing street flooding and possible basement water issues in the area.
2. Keep the street curb area in front of your property free of leaves and trash. These items also float to the nearest storm drain and accumulate on top of the storm drain grate. Again, blocked storm drain covers can cause localized flooding in the event of even a small downpour. Neighborhoods with mature trees along the street seem to have the most serious issues of blocked storm drain covers.

One of the most effective ways of preventing water damage to borough properties is to ensure that the storm drain system is clear and unobstructed. If we all work together and spend just a minimal amount of time on property maintenance, the potential for water damage to properties will be significantly reduced.

To assist you in this property maintenance, the borough provides Kraft bags to borough residents and businesses to bag your yard and tree waste. These bags are available for you to pick up anytime at the gate to the entrance of the Public Works facility at 272 West Colebrook Street or at the salt shed during regular business hours.

Municipal Service Fee Charges

To cover costs of Trash, Recycling, Street Sweeping and Street Lights, a fee is issued to each unit within the Borough twice a year. The Brown Statement Cards are mailed January 1st and July 1st and are due the 15th of the following month. Questions regarding your statement should be directed to the Trash and Recycling Coordinator at extension 10.

These statements can be paid at the borough office located at 15 East High Street (there is a drop box at the main entrance), the Susquehanna Bank on Market Square, or online at Manheimboro.org. We accept cash, checks made payable to "Manheim Borough" or credit cards.

TRASH UPDATES

Cardboard Dumpsters

The corrugated cardboard dumpsters will remain in the Municipal Parking Lot at the corner of North Wolf and East High Streets.

Magazine Dumpster

There is a dumpster in the parking lot of the VFW at 149 South Charlotte Street, for the recycling of magazines. All the money from this dumpster is used for the Ronald McDonald Houses, which are housing facilities for parents of children who are patients at the Hershey Medical Center.

Large Appliance Pick-up

Large appliance pick-up is scheduled for Thursday, October 17. A large appliance, or white good, is an appliance with a motor, engine, or compressor. For disposal of your appliance please be sure to purchase a \$15.00 Large Appliance Tag from the Borough Office.

If you already have one on-hand, please call the Borough Office and notify staff that you will be placing the item(s) curbside.

Tire Pick-up

Tires will also be picked up curbside on the day of large appliance pick-up. Tires must display a \$3.00 tire tag, also available for purchase at the Borough Office.

Woody Yard Waste Pick-up

WYW Days (on regular trash days) April 11 FREE DAY, then with green tags are April 25, May 9 & 23, June 6 & 20, July 5 & 18, August 1, 15, & 29, September 12 & 26. October 10.

All Tags are still purchased at the Borough Office and the Library.

Reminder:

Trash and recycling is not to be placed curbside before 6:00 PM the evening before your pick-up day. Placing trash and recycling containers curbside prior to the above time can create not only an inconvenience, but also a personal liability by unnecessarily obstructing the path for delivery personnel, emergency services, and other citizens. It is also an invitation for animals to rip open bags and scatter garbage.

Future projects:

The New Municipal Property at 45 Market Square is currently in the design phase for renovations and will be the future home of the Police Department and the Borough Office.

Shearer's Covered Bridge – Structural support repairs will need to be made in 2013.

Street Paving – With federal grant, Phase II of the Fulton/West End Neighborhood Street Improvement Project on Fulton Street from West End Ave. to High St. is scheduled for 2013.

Manheim Community Pool – A list is currently being compiled of necessary repairs for the 2013 season.

Mill and Hazel Streets – Stormwater management improvements on Mill Street and paving of portions of both streets are being evaluated for work in 2013 and/or 2014.

Lost & Found Dogs

Manheim Borough and Rapho Township entered into a “stray dog agreement” for stray dogs located in their municipalities. Both Municipalities have entered into contract with Lancaster County SPCA.



When ownership is determined the owner is responsible for (Prior to the retrieval of the dog):

\$60.00 recovery fee

\$30.00 / day boarding fee (for every full 24 hours held by Manheim Borough)

Any applicable ordinance or criminal violations which occurred stemming from the dog being at large.

The LCSPCA will have forms that need to be signed by the municipality when picking the animal up. Pick up times will be from 6AM to 6PM

Once the above fees are satisfied, owners may pick up their animals at the SPCA of Lancaster County if they are not currently at the Manheim Borough Dog Kennel.

Zoning & Code Compliance Information



Swimming Pools, Hot Tubs & Spas

Permits are required if you are considering installing a hot tub, spa, in-ground, above-ground, permanent, portable, or inflatable (quickset) pool. You will be required to install an approved barrier /fence around a pool, tub or spa of at least 48” high (4’) with a self-closing and self-latching gate; unless your pool is above-ground and has a 4’ wall and removable steps. The pool may not be any closer than 10’ to any property line and it must be kept sanitary, preferably with a filter/pump and chemicals to prevent it from becoming a breeding place for insects and mosquitoes.

Pumps and power supply cords must be approved and connected to an exterior GFI outlet. An all-weather extension cord running through a window or door is not permitted.

Garage & Yard Sales

If you are planning an event, a permit/registration is required!

This provides staff with pertinent information such as: dates for the sale, duration, and information on the person(s) responsible for removing the signs after the stated date of the sale.

Signs cannot be posted more than 3 days before the event. Signs may not be posted for sales or events located outside the Borough. When securing signs to poles, trees, etc. they must be taped (clear plastic masking tape) or tied in a wrap around fashion. Staples CANNOT be used to affix any signs. It is the intent of Borough Council to keep the Borough free of an accumulation of signs; therefore, a “permit” or “registration” is required, but, there is no fee associated with it. Feel free to contact the Zoning Office with any questions.
