Large Appliance Pick-up

Large appliance pick-up is scheduled for **Thursday, April 19**. A large appliance, or white good, is an appliance with a motor, engine, or compressor. For disposal of your appliance please be sure to purchase a \$15.00 Large Appliance Tag from the Borough Office.

If you already have one on-hand, please call the Borough Office and notify staff that you will be placing the item(s) curbside.

Tire Pick-up

Tires will also be picked up curbside on the day of large appliance pick-up. Tires must display a \$3.00 tire tag, also available for purchase at the Borough Office.

Cardboard Dumpsters

The cardboard dumpsters will remain in the Municipal Parking Lot at the corner of North Wolf and East High Streets (next to

the Ambulance Association).

Magazine Dumpster

There is a dumpster in the parking lot of the VFW at 149 South Charlotte Street, for the recycling of magazines. All the money from this dumpster is used for the Ronald McDonald Houses, which are housing facilities for parents of children who are patients at the Hershey Medical Center.

Woody Yard Waste Pick-up WYW Days (on regular trash days) **April 12 FREE DAY**, then with green tags are April 26, May 10 & 24, June 7 & 21, July 6 & 19, August 2, 16 & 30, September 13 & 27 and October 11. Please note that tags can also be purchased at the Manheim Community Library.

Leaf Pick-up

Leaf Pick-ups will begin on **Saturday October 27th**. The leaves need to be in the brown Kraft bags, but **DO NOT** need green tags

Reminder

Trash and recycling is not to be placed curbside before 6:00 PM the evening before your pick-up day.

Placing trash and recycling containers curbside prior to the

above time can create not only an inconvenience, but also a personal liability by unnecessarily obstructing the path for delivery personnel, emergency services, and other citizens. It is also an invitation for animals to rip open bags and scatter garbage.

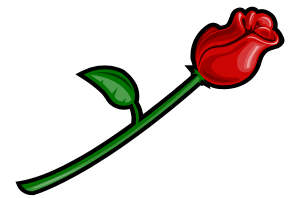

Borough Council meets the second and last Tuesdays of each month beginning at 7:00 PM in the lower level Community Room of the Borough Building at 15 East High Street.

New Office for the Manheim Borough Authority

As of January 1st the Manheim Borough Authority has moved their office to 18 East High Street. Their new phone number is 717-665-2737. All Water and Sewer bills can be paid at that location, the Susquehanna Bank on Market Square or on-line at www.manheimboroauthority.org. All checks should be made payable to Manheim Borough Authority. The authority will now be billing monthly.

The borough office is still at 15 East High Street. Municipal Fees are still paid at this location. Municipal Fee bills are issued twice a year January 1st with a due date of February 15th and July 1st with a due date of August 15th. Those checks should be made payable to Manheim Borough. Construction 2012

The following projects are planned for 2012:

- Shearer's Bridge – In partnership with the Manheim Community Farm Show and Manheim Central School District, a new roof has been installed on historic Shearer's Covered Bridge.
- Traffic Signal Pre-emption – With a grant from PennDOT, emergency vehicle signal pre-emption devices will be installed this year on all traffic signals in the Borough.
- Street Paving – With a federal grant and state Liquid Fuels funding, portions of Fulton, Frederick, West End, Linden, Laurel, and Hazel Streets are scheduled to be milled and paved this summer, along with various alley sections.
- Stormwater – Using a federal grant, new facilities are in design to address erosion and ponding issues in Logan Park near West End Avenue.
- Manheim Community Pool – A new roof will be installed on the main pool building. In partnership with the Manheim Summer Swim Team, a major leak will be repaired in the Competition (Adult) Pool.

Zoning & Code Compliance Information

PERMITS

Just a reminder that permits are required for the following Items:

- PODS (Portable on-Demand Storage Unit): If you are going to place a POD unit at your property you are required by Ordinance #597, §302.4 to procure a permit for the unit. Fee attached.
- Dumpsters: Require a permit. Fee attached.

Permit applications are available at the Borough Office.

Please call the Borough Office at 717-665-2461 ext. 14 if you have questions about the need for a permit for your project.

ORDINANCE REMINDERS

Sidewalks and Curbs: Reminder: In an effort to keep our public sidewalks safe for all pedestrians, cracked, deteriorated and/or damaged sidewalks and curbs that create a trip hazard or unsafe condition must be repaired. A No Fee permit will be issued when making the necessary repairs. Please contact the Zoning Office if you have any questions.

Property Maintenance:

Ordinance #544 states that the exterior property and premises shall be maintained in a clean, safe and sanitary condition which includes the following: High and Noxious Weeds and Grass, Garbage and Rubbish, Exterior Storage of Rubbish and Animal Waste/Accumulation. A Public Safety Official Notice and/or fines will be issued for violations of this Ordinance.

Rental Property Owners:

Manheim Borough has adopted the Disruptive Tenant (3 Strikes) Ordinance #619. All residential rental properties in the Borough will be inspected on a 4 year cycle. These inspections have been taking place prior to this ordinance, however all properties inspected since this ordinance was passed will be issued a rental permit which must be displayed somewhere within the unit. From the Desk of the Police Chief

On January 1, 2012, the Manheim Borough Police Department began to provide service to the residents of Rapho Township for the first year of a three-year contract. To meet the needs of the Township, the Borough increased their capabilities by hiring 6 additional patrol officers and a detective, and purchasing 2 new vehicles. Police Chief Joseph Stauffer has supervised this transition, and has already seen excellent results. "The mission of the Manheim Borough Police Department is to provide the highest quality law enforcement services to protect the citizens of Manheim Borough and Rapho Township," says Chief Stauffer. "Our officers are trained to be professional and courteous in providing for the general safety and welfare of residents and travelers in these two communities."

Chief Stauffer is extremely pleased to now be serving Rapho Township. He notes that the officers have enjoyed getting to know the residents and roads of the Township. All officers of the department are included in the rotation to patrol in Rapho and in Manheim, so they gain expertise in both communities. "The officers have responded to a variety of calls in the Township that they wouldn't ordinarily have encountered in the Borough," the Chief notes. On each shift, 2 officers are assigned to the Township, which is divided into sectors.

Chief Stauffer urges residents to be safe by keeping cars and residences locked. Identity theft is also a real concern, and Chief Stauffer advises that residents should never give personal information by phone or email. For non-emergency questions, Rapho residents are encouraged to call the Manheim police station at 665-2481 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Residents should always dial 911 for emergency calls involving life-threatening situations or crimes in progress.
