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WINTER TIPS FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Winter Season is quickly approaching and with that comes the need for borough residents to work together so each snow and ice event can be handled in the safest way possible. The following tips will assist the Public Works Department in safely and effectively removing snow and ice from the streets during a snow event.

1. Whenever possible, use off-street parking during a snow event. This allows the snowplows to clear the street back to the curb. This allows room for the next storm or water to run from the snow melt toward the storm drains.
2. DO NOT THROW OR BLOW SNOW ONTO THE STREET. When this is done and the snow refreezes overnight it can become quite icy and dangerous to traffic and a potential liability to the homeowner. Violators may be subject to prosecution as this is a citable offense. If you have someone other than yourself doing your snow removal remind them as well as you would be responsible for your property.
3. NO CARS SHOULD BE PARKED IN A CUL-DE-SAC. Plowing cul-de-sacs can be time consuming, and having cars on the street makes it very difficult to clear the snow and/or turn around.
4. During a plowing operation, snow will go into your driveway. If possible, wait until the street is plowed before clearing driveway openings. When possible, shovel the snow to the right side of your driveway as you face the street. This allows the snowplow to take the snow away from your driveway.
5. Snow and ice must be cleared from sidewalks within 12 hours after the snow stops falling. We also ask for your help in clearing snow and ice from the fire hydrants and stormwater inlets on or near your property.

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Recycling

Recycling Bins: Recycling Bins are available at the Borough Office for \$5.00. However, you can now use your own plastic container up to 32 gallons for recycling. Stop by the Borough Office today and pick up 2 **Free** large Recycling Decals to put on each side of your container so our Recycling Drivers can easily spot your recycling container. Contact the Borough Office with any questions and become part of **REDUCE REUSE RECYCLE**

Cardboard Dumpsters: We have 4 Corrugated Cardboard Dumpsters Two corrugated cardboard dumpsters are located in the **Municipal Parking Lot at the corner of North Wolf and East High Streets** and two are located at the **Logan Park Parking Lot off of West Ferdinand Street.**

Magazine Dumpster: There is a dumpster in the parking lot of the VFW at 149 South Charlotte Street, for the recycling of magazines. All the money from this dumpster is used for the Ronald McDonald Houses in Hershey.

Large Appliance Pick-up: The next large appliance pick-up is scheduled for Thursday, **October 20th**. A large appliance, or white good, is an appliance with a motor, engine, or compressor. For disposal of your appliance please be sure to purchase a \$15.00 Large Appliance Tag from the Borough Office.

Tire Pick-up: Tires will also be picked up curbside on the day of large appliance pick-up **October 20th**. Tires must display a \$3.00 tire tag, also available for purchase at the Borough Office.

Woody Yard Waste Pick-up: WYW Days (on regular trash days October 6th & 20th) All Tags are still purchased at the Borough Office.

Leaf Pick-ups: Leaf Pick-ups (Saturdays) start **November 5th**. They will also be held November 12 & 19 and December 3 & 10. **The bags do not need tags.**

Reminder Trash and recycling is not to be placed curbside before 6:00 PM the evening before your pick-up day. If your trash or recycling is missed, please contact the Borough Office immediately.. Covered Devices (televisions, computers, monitors etc...) are no longer collected curbside. The County offers free disposal of household hazardous waste. Zoning & Code Compliance Information

All trees and bushes overhanging a street or alley shall be trimmed so that no part is less than 8 feet above the surface of the sidewalk or 14 feet above the surface of the street. The property owner is responsible to keep all trees and bushes in compliance with Borough Ordinance.

All exterior property and premises, and the interior of every structure, shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish and garbage. Tags are available, for a small fee, at the Borough office for extra trash and oversized items. Garbage and rubbish must be stored in an approved leak proof container with tight fitting covers and located in an appropriate location within the property lines. In an effort to keep our public sidewalks safe for all pedestrians, the Borough will be checking sidewalks and curbs in the Borough for areas that are cracked, deteriorated and/or damaged, such situations that create a trip hazard and/or an unsafe condition for pedestrian traffic. A no fee permit will be issued when making the necessary repairs. Please contact the Zoning Officer if you have any questions.

Do you rent or are you a landlord? Ordinance #619 was adopted in 2012 to protect and promote the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Borough, to establish rights and obligations of owners and occupants relating to all residential rental units and to encourage owners and occupants to maintain and improve rental housing within the Borough. The Ordinance provides for systematic inspections every three years, registration and licensing of all residential rental units, and penalties if found to be not in compliance.
